

Arrival Day - Pick Up From Airport & transportation to hotel

Our guide will pick you up at Kilimanjaro International Airport (JRO) or Arusha Airport (ARK) and take you to your accommodation in Arusha. As local Tanzanians, our guides know well the country and Arusha city, so you'll be in good hands from when you arrive to the moment you leave.



Day 1 | Option 1

Tarangire to Lake Manyara National Park

After starting the first day with an early hotel pick up at around 06.30am, we will make our way to **Lake Manyara**. A full day game drive awaits you with picnic alongside the magnificent **Lake Manyara**. Although this park is relatively small with just 330 square kilometers, it boasts no fewer than 11 distinct ecosystems (from open savannah to dense evergreen forest).

Lake Manyara National Park is home to the three big cat species – lions, leopards and cheetahs, but it is most famous for its three climbing lions – so always make sure to look up in order not to miss a surprise. Next to buffalos, zebras, monkeys and giraffes Lake Manyara, furthermore us also a well-known birding hotspot with over 400 recorded species. After a full day in the park you will arrive at Twiga campsite, where you will be able to relax and enjoy dinner.

Day 2 | Option 1

Ngorongoro Crater Tour




On the 2nd day after your last early breakfast, you will be driving towards **Ngorongoro crater** in order to descend into the volcano valley.

Supported by year-round water supply and fodder, the **Ngorongoro** supports a vast variety of animals which includes herds of buffaloes, wildebeest, zebras, eland, warthog, hippos and giant African elephants. Some 25.000 wild creatures, many of them as mentioned hoofed animals attract a large number of predators, like hyena, cheetah, leopards and lions. In fact, in recent years, the crater houses Africa's highest proliferation of lions per square mile.

Another big draw card to this picturesque area is the possibility of seeing the endangered species of the black rhino. The number of black rhinos is very low and although they can weigh up to 1.400kg it is amazing how easily they can camouflage their great bulk as they hide deep in the bush – so keep your eye out for their curved back and long horns sticking out of the grass!

After a stop and lunch at Lake Magadi, a large but shallow alkaline lake in the southwest conner, which is one of the main features of the crater, we will start our return **back to Arusha Town**.







Package Inclusions:

Exact arrival time / departure time should be provided as early as possible in order to organize the pick-up as well as the drop-off at the airport.

Our cooks and drivers are doing a great job and are happy about any tips.



Arrival Day – Pick Up From Airport & transportation to hotel

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Day 1 | Option 2

Arusha to Tarangire National Park

After starting the first day with an early hotel pick up at around 06.30am, we will make our way to **Tarangire National Park.** The **Tarangire National Park** natural vegetation consists mainly of Acacia woodland and giant African Baobab trees, with huge swamp areas in the eastern and southern parts. Both the river and the swamps act like a magnet for wild animals which makes this park especially interesting during Tanzania's dry season.

The Tarangire National Park is known to contain some of the largest elephant groups in Africa counting herds with up to 300 animals. Moreover this 2800 square kilometers area is home to four of the African big five, except for the black rhino. It is also home to three endangered animals that can be found nowhere else in the country– the Greater Kudu, the Fringed-eared Oryx, as well as a few Ashy Starlings. Between June and November of each year, Tarangire National park plays host to a migration circle that includes 3000 elephants, 25000 wildbeasts and 5000 zebras. After an exciting day you will be able to finish with a relaxing evening and Tanzanian dinner at Twiga campsite.


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
